NATURE OF THE ACTION

1. This is a civil-rights action brought by Plaintiff Spencer Lowe under 42 U.S.C. § 1983 and R.C. 2307.60.
2. Officer Lowe was fired because North Royalton and its officials mistakenly believed that he leaked records to the media showing that North Royalton Police Chief Keith Tarase and Lt. James Cutler feloniously tampered with a police report to cover up a fellow

officer's bad behavior. Though Officer Lowe blew the whistle following Ohio law, he never leaked any documents to reporters. Still, Defendants retaliated against him for the perceived exercise of his First Amendment rights.

3. On October 11, 2025, Officer Lowe pulled over Orange Village Police Department Deputy Chief Patrick O'Callahan after catching the policeman swerving and speeding. Officer Lowe determined that O'Callahan was intoxicated, and he found multiple guns on his person and in the vehicle. Officer Lowe arrested O'Callahan for Operating a Vehicle Impaired (OVI) and felony improper handling of a firearm.

4. North Royalton Police Chief Keith Tarase and Lt. James Cutler, with City Prosecuting Attorney James McDonnell's improper encouragement, later accessed Officer Lowe's report and deleted the felony charge for improper handling of a firearm. This change, done to protect a fellow officer from publicity about potential felony charges, constituted falsification, tampering with records, and tampering with evidence.

5. On October 15, 2025, Officer Lowe reported this criminal falsification to North Royalton Mayor and Safety Service Director Lawrence "Larry" Antoskiewicz by email. When Antoskiewicz failed to correct this criminal activity, Officer Lowe reported the corruption to the Cuyahoga County Prosecuting Attorney's office, the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

6. In retaliation for his report outside the chain of command and from the subsequent media coverage, Antoskiewicz ordered a sham investigation and fired Officer Lowe in violation of Ohio's whistleblower statute and various criminal laws barring intimidation and retaliation against witnesses of a crime.

## PARTIES

7. Plaintiff Spencer Lowe is a former North Royalton police officer who resides in North Lawrence in Stark County, Ohio.
8. Defendant City of North Royalton is in Cuyahoga County, Ohio.
9. At relevant times, Defendant Larry Antoskiewicz was the mayor and safety service director of the City of North Royalton. He is a resident of North Royalton in Cuyahoga County, Ohio. He resigned from office effective April 30, 2026.
10. Defendant Keith Tarase is the chief of the North Royalton Police Department. He resides in Brunswick in Medina County, Ohio.

## JURISDICTION AND VENUE

11. This Court has subject-matter jurisdiction over the state-law claims against Defendants. The claims are statutory claims under Ohio law. The amount in controversy exceeds \$25,000.
12. This Court has personal jurisdiction because the City of North Royalton is in Cuyahoga County, and all Defendants work there. Officer Lowe's claims for relief also arose here.
13. Venue is proper in this Court because Defendants do business or live in Cuyahoga County and because the events at issue took place here.

## FACTUAL BACKGROUND

### **NORTH ROYALTON POLICE DEPARTMENT IS PLAGUED WITH CONTROVERSY IN RECENT MONTHS**

14. The City of North Royalton has faced negative publicity and issues within its police department for months. In particular, Chief Tarase has been under fire over various

allegations of misconduct.

15. In April 2025, officers and sergeants, represented by the Fraternal Order of Police Lodge 15, passed a no-confidence resolution against Chief Tarase.<sup>1</sup> Officers said Tarase had harassed and retaliated against them, creating a toxic work environment.

16. More recently, Chief Tarase was accused of punishing a clerk for taking funeral leave after her father died, bullying clerks, and physically harassing a corrections officer at North Royalton jail. Cleveland.com and other local media covered the accusations.<sup>2</sup>

17. With its chief law-enforcement officer making the news, North Royalton officials have obsessively cared about the government's plummeting public image.

18. When Officer Lowe again questioned Chief Tarase's integrity, something that ended up receiving significant media coverage, he unknowingly made himself a target of retaliation.

**OFFICER LOWE ARRESTS A DRUNKEN ORANGE VILLAGE DEPUTY CHIEF AND CHARGES HIM WITH OVI AND IMPROPER HANDLING OF A FIREARM**

19. Officer Lowe served North Royalton's residents as a patrolman from February 2023 until April 14, 2026.

20. In the late hours on October 11, 2025, Officer Lowe was patrolling for the City of North Royalton near Royalton Road and Bennett Road when he noticed O'Callahan's car swerving and speeding. At about 11:50 PM, Officer Lowe pulled O'Callahan over.

21. O'Callahan, the Orange Village deputy police chief, was visibly drunk. He had

red, bloodshot, watery eyes and was slurring his speech. The initial stop was caught on Officer Lowe's body camera, and the subsequent events were also caught on Detective Steve Zahurskey's and Officer Brett Bunge's cameras. (Body camera footage manually filed as Ex. 1A-C.)

22. After Officer Lowe asked O'Callahan where he was going, and O'Callahan refused to answer, he pulled out his deputy-chief badge and asked Officer Lowe, "Can I show you this?"

23. This was an improper and unethical attempt by O'Callahan to influence Officer Lowe in the exercise of his duties.

24. Officer Lowe read the badge, replying, "Deputy Chief for Orange? Orange County?" O'Callahan mistakenly answered, "Yes." Officer Lowe asked where that was. O'Callahan, slurring his words, struggled to correct himself and say, "Cuyahoga County."

25. Officer Lowe asked if O'Callahan had anything to drink. He replied, "Not much." Officer Lowe asked, "How much is not much?" After a pause, O'Callahan repeated, "Not much."

26. Officer Lowe went back to his car and radioed for backup. Detective Zahursky arrived minutes later, followed by Officer Bunge, the officer in charge of the shift.

27. Officer Lowe returned to O'Callahan's car and asked him to get out of the car.

28. Officer Lowe asked O'Callahan if he had a gun on him. O'Callahan said, "yes," and began reaching for his pocket. Officer Lowe told him not to touch it.

29. After getting out of the car, O'Callahan had to hold onto the side to keep his balance. Officer Lowe patted him down and took a loaded gun from O'Callahan's front pocket. The gun had a round in the chamber.

30. O'Callahan, leaning against his car, claimed that he knew Officer Zahursky.

Zahursky, though, was standing right in front of him, and O'Callahan did not acknowledge or identify him. He was too drunk to realize the officer he claimed to know was right there.

31. In any case, this, too, was O'Callahan improperly and unethically angling for special treatment by name-dropping.

32. Officer Zahursky said O'Callahan smelled like alcohol.

33. O'Callahan refused to do a breathalyzer test or any field-sobriety tests.

34. O'Callahan told Officer Lowe, "I'm really sorry. If I did this, I'm really sorry."

35. Officer Lowe handcuffed him and arrested him.

36. Knowing that O'Callahan already illegally improperly handled one firearm and seeing his police duty belt peeking out from under a shirt in the back seat, Officer Lowe had a legal basis to search his car for more guns. For example, the "automobile exception" permits a warrantless search of a vehicle "if the officers have probable cause to believe that the vehicle contains evidence of a crime." *United States v. Galaviz*, 645 F.3d 347, 355 (6th Cir. 2011) (quoting *United States v. Smith*, 510 F.3d 641, 647 (6th Cir. 2007)). The search may include all parts of a legitimately stopped vehicle, including the trunk, compartments, and containers. *California v. Acevedo*, 500 U.S. 565, 570 (1991). He found a pistol holstered in O'Callahan's duty belt, which was sitting in plain view on the back seat of his car, and another gun in the car's center console. Both were loaded and had rounds in the chamber.

37. Under R.C. 2923.13(B), "[n]o person shall knowingly transport or have a loaded firearm in a motor vehicle in such a manner that the firearm is accessible to the operator or any passenger without leaving the vehicle." A violation of this subsection is a fourth-degree felony.

38. Under R.C. 2923.16(C):

No person shall knowingly transport or have a firearm in a motor vehicle, unless the person may lawfully possess that firearm under applicable law of this state or the United States, **the firearm is unloaded**, and the firearm is carried in one of the following ways:

- (1) In a closed package, box, or case;
- (2) In a compartment that can be reached only by leaving the vehicle;
- (3) In plain sight or secured in a rack or holder made for the purpose;
- (4) If the firearm is at least twenty-four inches in overall length as measured from the muzzle to the part of the stock furthest from the muzzle and if the barrel is at least eighteen inches in length, either in plain sight with the action open or the weapon stripped, or, if the firearm is of a type on which the action will not stay open or which cannot easily be stripped, in plain sight.

(Emphasis added).

39. A violation of this portion is a fourth-degree misdemeanor.

40. Under R.C. 2923.16(D), “[n]o person shall knowingly transport or have a loaded handgun in a motor vehicle if, at the time of that transportation or possession, any of the following applies: (1) The person is under the influence of alcohol.” A violation of this portion is a fifth-degree *felony*.

41. While completing the arrest, Officer Lowe could hear Officer Bungee on the phone with Defendant Lt. Cutler, discussing both the OVI charge and a potential improper-handling-of-a-firearm charge. Lt. Cutler told Officer Bungee, regarding O’Callahan, “If you’re in for a penny, you’re in for a pound. You might as well charge him for felony improper handling.”

42. This was legally correct.

43. Officer Lowe returned to the North Royalton Police Department early Sunday morning to draft his report, before heading home at the end of his shift. He entered both OVI and felony improper handling of a firearm into the “charges” field of the report and sent it to his shift sergeant to review. Officer Lowe also completed all the necessary paperwork to charge someone with a felony, including the personal-identifier form, the felony form, and the complaint.

44. Officer Lowe called the duty judge on Sunday for a bond for O’Callahan, which officers do only if the arrestee faces felony charges.

45. Sgt. Daniel Waters reviewed Officer Lowe’s report and approved it.

46. Officer Lowe, done with his paperwork, headed home because his shift was over.

**CHIEF TARASE AND LT. CUTLER, TO TRY TO PROTECT A FELLOW POLICE OFFICER FROM CRIMINAL CHARGES—OR AT LEAST PUBLICITY ABOUT THEM—DELETED FROM OFFICER LOWE’S REPORT ANY MENTION OF A FELONY, ALTERING AND FALSIFYING A PUBLIC RECORD**

47. On Tuesday, October 14, 2025, Officer Lowe was prepared to go to court to testify about O’Callahan’s arrest. Before heading in, he texted North Royalton’s records clerk, Michael Hurley, to ensure all the proper paperwork was ready.

48. Hurley texted Officer Lowe back, “[Prosecutor James] McDonnell told me to hold off on sending.” *See* texts, Ex. 2.

49. When Officer Lowe arrived at the North Royalton police station, Detective Zahursky, who backed up Officer Lowe during O’Callahan’s arrest, stopped Lowe to talk about the supplement to Lowe’s report. Zahursky noted a minor error in Lowe’s report—whether the duty gun was covered by a shirt in the backseat—and added that, other than that, Lowe did a good job.

50. The duty gun was covered by the shirt in the backseat, but the rest of the duty gun belt—easily recognizable by an officer who wears one every shift—was visible.

51. Officer Lowe then went to meet with Lt. Cutler, who pointed out the same minor issue. Officer Lowe said he would clarify the report.

52. Lt. Cutler then asked about a portion of the report in which Officer Lowe recounted O'Callahan flashing his badge at Lowe and asking, "Can I show you this?"

53. Lt. Cutler asked if that line needed to be included.

54. Officer Lowe replied that it absolutely needed to be included because O'Callahan's words and actions went to his culpable state of mind. O'Callahan tried to leverage his status as a law-enforcement officer to evade an OVI and a felony charge.

55. Lt. Cutler inexplicably insisted that Officer Lowe remove the line from his report.

56. There was no rational reason to do that other than trying to cover for O'Callahan's improper and unethical effort to leverage his law-enforcement status.

57. Lt. Cutler also complained to Officer Lowe that local-station WJW Fox 8 News had somehow heard of the arrest. Though, ultimately, no story was published until weeks later, this was the beginning of expressions to Lowe about Defendants' paranoia about media coverage and their wrongful suspicion that Officer Lowe spoke to news outlets.

58. He did not.

59. Officer Lowe assured Lt. Cutler that he did not talk to Fox 8 or tell anyone outside the department about the incident.

60. On the way out of Lt. Cutler's office, Officer Lowe noticed that his personnel file was open and documents were sprawled out across a desk next to Cutler's. Even at this early stage, Defendants were contemplating retaliating against Officer Lowe.

61. Officer Lowe went downstairs at the station to edit his report. He fixed the minor inconsistency and, fearing retaliation if he didn't do so after seeing his personnel file out, complied with Lt. Cutler's wish to delete the portion about O'Callahan flashing his police badge.

62. Still expecting that he would need to go to court to testify about O'Callahan, Officer Lowe called upstairs to North Royalton police leadership for instructions. Lt. Cutler told him to head home for the day.

63. Officer Lowe thought this was unusual but left the station.

64. That night, as part of her regular review of patrol officers' performance, Sgt. FloAnn Rybicki reviewed Officer Lowe's body-camera footage from the arrest. Sgt. Rybicki read Lowe's corresponding report to ensure what happened in the footage matched the report.

65. Sgt. Rybicki sent Officer Lowe a text commending him for doing a good job on what was likely a tense arrest.

66. Officer Lowe replied that it was an unusual situation, adding that, rather than having him go to court to testify Tuesday, as he would with any other felony case, Lt. Cutler sent him home. Officer Lowe asked Sgt. Rybicki to check his report in the department's "Sundance" system to ensure the felony charges were still part of the report.

67. Sgt. Rybicki opened the Sundance system, which allows review of various fields in each police report. The system has a history log that tracks who makes changes to each report and when. The history screen is fundamentally part of the police report, which is a public record.

68. The history screen documents the business and functions of the City of North Royalton. It is not confidential.

69. The Sundance history screen showed that Defendants Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler accessed the report and removed Officer Lowe's felony charge for improper handling of a

firearm. *See* Ex. 3. Throughout the subsequent investigations the city commissioned, Defendants never disputed that they removed the felony charge from Officer Lowe's report.

70. Under North Royalton Police Department's own policies, "Reports that have been approved by a supervisor and submitted to the Records [*sic*] for filing and distribution **shall not be modified or altered** except by way of a supplemental report. Reviewed reports that have not yet been submitted to Records may only be corrected or modified **by the authoring employee** and with the knowledge and authorization of the reviewing supervisor." North Royalton Police Department Policy 322.5 (emphasis added).

71. Under that policy, Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler could not delete the charge. They could only have asked Officer Lowe to write a supplemental report to correct or modify **an error**.

72. Including that felony charge was no error. Lt. Cutler told the officers on scene to charge O'Callahan with improper handling of a firearm.

73. On information and belief, this isn't the first time North Royalton police acted to protect O'Callahan for drunk driving. Two other times, patrol officers pulled O'Callahan over for drunk driving and released him with a warning. He wasn't charged either time—despite being visibly intoxicated.

74. Officer Lowe was the first North Royalton officer to have enough integrity to hold O'Callahan—a fellow police officer—accountable for breaking the law.

75. Officer Lowe asked Sgt. Rybicki to print a copy of the felony complaint and personal identifier form Lowe had previously drafted, a copy of the current version of the report, and a screenshot of the history tab in Sundance. Sgt. Rybicki printed the documents, put them into a sealed envelope, and left them in Officer Lowe's secured department mailbox.

## OFFICER LOWE REPORTED THE TAMPERING AND FALSIFICATION

76. On Wednesday, October 15, 2025, Officer Lowe called Mayor and Safety Service Director Larry Antoskiewicz to discuss Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler's tampering. Antoskiewicz did not answer, so Officer Lowe left a voicemail detailing the situation. S. Lowe, voicemail, attached as Ex. 4.

77. Then, that day at 9:14 PM, Officer Lowe emailed Antoskiewicz "reporting what I reasonably believe to be felony violations." S. Lowe, email, Oct. 15, 2025, attached as Ex. 5.

78. In this written report, Officer Lowe detailed his stop, including finding the guns on O'Callahan's person and in other parts of his car. He added that, after the narrative of his report was approved, Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler accessed the Sundance system and deleted the felony charge from his report.

79. Officer Lowe included the evidence he had—pictures of the printed documents Sgt. Rybicki retrieved showing Lt. Cutler accessed and changed his report. He also included a copy of the report and the personal identifier.

80. Officer Lowe told Antoskiewicz that the fraudulent deletion of the felony charges criminally violated R.C. 2913.42(B)(4) (tampering with records) and RC 2921.12 (tampering with evidence). He added that it may also constitute obstructing justice/official business and dereliction of duty.

81. Tampering with records, when the writing or record belongs to a local, state, or federal government entity, is a third-degree felony.

82. Tampering with evidence, too, is a third-degree felony.

83. Under R.C. 2921.32, a person who obstructs justice, when the person they're aiding committed a felony, is guilty of a fifth-degree felony.

84. Officer Lowe asked Antoskiewicz, who served as both mayor and safety service director, to restore the report to its original, approved form and to reach out to an outside organization to investigate Chief Tarase and Cutler's conduct. Antoskiewicz, in his dual role, had the authority and ability to do both.

85. Antoskiewicz, as safety service director, is in the police department's chain of command. Under R.C. 737.02, a safety service director "shall be the executive head of the police and fire departments and the chief administrative authority of the charity, correction, and building departments. He shall have all powers and duties connected with and incident to the appointment, regulation, and government of such departments except as otherwise provided by law."

86. On October 16, 2025, at 1:27 PM, Antoskiewicz replied, "Patrolman Lowe, Thank You [*sic*] for your e-mail. I have referred it to the Law Department for their advice and guidance."

87. In the 24 hours after Officer Lowe reported the tampering, Antoskiewicz made no effort to return the report to its original state. Indeed, to this day, the report still contains Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler's fraudulent changes.

88. On October 17, 2025, Officer Lowe's union representative, Brian Smith, sent a letter from Lowe via fax to Cuyahoga County Prosecuting Attorney Michael O'Malley. The letter detailed the fraudulent tampering with Lowe's report and noted that Antoskiewicz failed to correct the report within 24 hours. S. Lowe, letter, Oct. 17, 2025, attached as Ex. 6.

89. Officer Lowe asked Prosecutor O'Malley to open an independent investigation into Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler's conduct. He also asked O'Malley to ensure that O'Callahan was held accountable and that the integrity of his prosecution would be preserved.

90. Officer Lowe attached the proof he had to this letter, including his report to Antoskiewicz, the mayor's response, and the supporting documents showing that Lt. Cutler and Chief Tarase tampered with his report.

91. The same day, Officer Lowe's union representative also sent this letter to the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Office, the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

92. Each of these reports constituted protected speech, both under the First Amendment and under Ohio's Whistleblower Protection Act.

93. On October 18, 2025, at 3:13 PM, North Royalton Law Director Thomas Kelly emailed Officer Lowe in response to his email to Antoskiewicz, announcing that the city hired James J. Hofelich, of the Hofelich Law Firm, to conduct an internal investigation.

94. Hofelich has no substantive experience in police operations or internal affairs. It's unclear why North Royalton selected him to investigate potential tampering within the police department rather than a more experienced lawyer or an outside law-enforcement agency. But the North Royalton police officers' union, Fraternal Order of Police Lodge 15's, President Dennis Soltis, in a press release, alleged that Hofelich was a "personal acquaintance" of law director Thomas Kelly.

95. As Hofelich supposedly "investigated," Cleveland news outlets obtained a copy of Officer Lowe's letter to the Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office. The outlets had yet to report on O'Callahan's arrest, and, as of October 29, 2025, according to Cleveland.com, North

Royalton Police Department had yet to release Officer Lowe's report.<sup>3</sup> The news of the incident and potential cover-up broke on October 29, 2025, and various outlets followed up with additional stories in the days that followed.

96. That day, WKYC published a broadcast showing Officer Lowe's report, the personal identifier form from O'Callahan's arrest, the North Royalton Police Department policy on updating reports, a fax cover sheet from FOP Lodge 15 representative Smith, emails, and the formal complaint. Some of the forms had O'Callahan's personal information, including his social security number.

97. Officer Lowe did not release the records to any media outlet. Nor did he ask anyone else to do so.

98. Sometime between October 17 and December 2, 2025, the City learned that Officer Lowe reported Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler's misconduct to the prosecutor's office.

**RATHER THAN HOLDING CHIEF TARASE AND LT. CUTLER RESPONSIBLE FOR TAMPERING, DEFENDANTS WEAPONIZED INTERNAL INVESTIGATIONS AGAINST OFFICER LOWE**

99. On or about December 2, 2025, Hofelich completed his supposed investigative report.

100. According to Hofelich, City Prosecutor McDonnell reviewed Officer Lowe's report and body camera on October 14, 2025, three days after the arrest was made and the day Officer Lowe expected to appear in Court to testify to the felony charges. At about 2 PM—after Lowe already appeared at the station and was told he wasn't needed to testify—McDonnell called Chief Tarase and asked him to remove the felony charges from the cover page of Lowe's

report.

101. The report found—and, as part of the investigation, Chief Tarase admitted—that Tarase and Lt. Cutler altered Officer Lowe’s report to remove the felony charges against O’Callahan. The pair admitted to engaging in the felonious misconduct Hofelich was hired to investigate.

102. Even so, Hofelich claimed that Prosecutor McDonnell, Lt. Cutler, and Chief Tarase did nothing wrong, and thus did not recommend any discipline against them. He baselessly concluded that McDonnell, as prosecutor, was authorized to reduce the charges.

103. Though McDonnell may have been authorized to exercise his discretion and *reduce* the charges, he was not authorized to change a public-record police report. Hofelich provided no basis for his claim.

104. Hofelich also claimed there was no wrongdoing because Officer Lowe consented to a reduction of charges.

105. But Officer Lowe did not consent to his report being altered.

106. Hofelich’s report mentioned nothing about improper disclosure of information.

107. Hofelich’s timeline of the events raises questions. First, he claims that McDonnell, Cutler, and Tarase made the decision to change the charges on October 14, 2025. But according to documents collected as part of a later internal investigation into Officer Lowe, a North Royalton Police Detective, James Nubbie, told Orange Village Police Internal Affairs by text **on October 13**, that the charges may be changed. *See* J. Nubbie, texts, attached as Ex. 7.

108. Orange Village Lt. Stephen Attewell replied to Detective Nubbie: “Your Chief mentioned you may find out about the charges this afternoon,” revealing that Chief Tarase talked to Orange Village Police officials on or before October 13, 2025, and then later changed

the report to remove the felony charges. In a written statement as part of the investigation into Officer Lowe, Chief Tarase admitted to talking to Attewell.

109. Hofelich's report fails to mention any of this.

110. The day the Hofelich report released, Mayor Antoskiewicz, in a letter to North Royalton's City Council, delivered the report's results. Antoskiewicz claimed that Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler committed no misconduct and closed the investigation against them.

111. Antoskiewicz added, though, that there would be further investigation into the "possible disclosure of information required to be confidential, as well as to the possibility that the allegations are, or may have been, the result of illegal activity."

112. In short, he told City Council that the city would reach out to an outside agency to investigate Officer Lowe for blowing the whistle on Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler's illegal conduct.

113. Antoskiewicz launched that investigation in January 2026 in retaliation for Officer Lowe for reporting his superior officers for tampering with records. Rather than hiring an outsider for the investigation, Antoskiewicz tapped North Royalton's own department.

114. Meanwhile, on December 24, 2025, police-union lawyer Brian Smith, on behalf of the union and Officer Lowe, faxed Ohio Attorney General Dave Yost a letter detailing Chief Tarase's admission in the Hofelich investigative report, and asked BCI to investigate. Smith also sent a follow-up letter to Cuyahoga County Prosecuting Attorney O'Malley and the FBI.

#### **NORTH ROYALTON OFFICIALS RETALIATED AGAINST OFFICER LOWE FOR REPORTING THEIR MISCONDUCT**

115. On January 13, 2026, Mayor Antoskiewicz officially ordered Chief Tarase to launch the internal "investigation" into Officer Lowe. Tarase assigned North Royalton Lt.

Charles Redrup and Sgt. John Stolarski of the department's internal-affairs division to investigate.

116. The investigation's scope was listed as "the potential improper release of these materials [the report and accompanying documents on O'Callahan's arrest] to an individual or the media."

117. As stated before, Officer Lowe did not release the report and documents to any media outlet. He sent them to the safety service director and his union representative who was helping him make his whistleblower report.

118. On January 22, 2026, Redrup, Stolarski, and outside counsel James Budzik<sup>4</sup> interviewed Officer Lowe about the records. Union representative Smith appeared alongside Officer Lowe, representing him during the interview.

119. The trio questioned Officer Lowe about with whom he shared the records related to O'Callahan's arrest. Lowe told them that he shared them with his union representative, Mr. Smith, and Safety Service Director/Mayor Antoskiewicz. He confirmed that he did not share them with the media.

120. Officer Lowe engaged in protected activity when he shared the documents with his union representative.

121. And any perception that he shared them with media is a perception that he spoke as a private citizen on matters of public concern—also protected activity.

<sup>4</sup> Budzik may try to enter an appearance on behalf of the City of North Royalton, individual Defendants, or both. This would be a conflict of interest, as Budzik himself participated directly in the retaliation against Officer Lowe and is, at a minimum, a witness and likely culpable. That is under investigation. He should put his insurance carrier on notice. If he tries to enter an appearance, Plaintiff will move to disqualify him.

122. So is a report to a prosecutor or another law-enforcement agency about crimes by public officials.

123. After Stolarski and Redrup ran out of questions, Budzik asked for an intermission to talk to the officers. When they returned to the interview, Stolarski and Redrup had more questions.

124. On February 24, 2026, Redrup and Stolarski issued a report claiming that Officer Lowe, with Sgt. Rybicki's help, removed and released department records without authorization. The report found that Lowe provided the documents to union attorney, Mr. Smith, who was Lowe's union representative in the matter.

125. The report revealed that North Royalton police officials contemplated an internal investigation from the moment Tarase and Cutler learned of Lowe's report to Mayor Antoskiewicz. Lt. Redrup, of internal affairs, was present on October 16, 2025, when law director Thomas Kelly contacted Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler to inform them that Officer Lowe accused them of tampering with records. From the beginning, North Royalton police officials were plotting their retaliation, and Lt. Redrup, who supposedly impartially investigated Officer Lowe for releasing department records, was in on it. According to their own February 2026 report, Lt. Redrup and Sgt. Stolarski were regularly involved in meetings on the cover-up throughout October.

126. The question the investigation sought to answer—how local news-media outlets got unredacted police documents—was never answered.

127. The report concluded there was insufficient evidence to determine who leaked the documents to the media. There was no evidence that Officer Lowe was the leaker.

128. As news spread about the arrest and subsequent cover-up, North Royalton's City

Council had questions about its police chief's behavior. City officials responded by tarnishing Officer Lowe's reputation.

129. In a March 5, 2026 letter, law director Kelly finally gave the first public explanation for why Prosecutor James O'Donnell allegedly declined to charge O'Callahan for improperly handling a firearm.

130. In his letter, Kelly took unnecessary and unwarranted shots at Officer Lowe's arrest and decision to charge O'Callahan with an OVI, calling them "weak."

131. O'Callahan pleaded no contest to the OVI charge on February 23, 2026, about a week before Kelly's letter.

132. Kelly also claimed that Lowe's search of O'Callahan's vehicle was "wholly improper, constitutionally infirm, and violative of the Defendants' Fourth Amendment rights." He wrote, "[t]he Prosecutor thereupon directed the Chief: 'Don't send the gun charges (over to Parma.)'"

133. This allegation ignores the fact that Officer Lowe lawfully found a loaded gun *in O'Callahan's pocket* in addition to the two guns Lowe found in his car. Even if the search violated the Fourth Amendment—it didn't—Prosecutor O'Donnell could still use the evidence of the gun found on O'Callahan's person to prosecute him for improper handling of a firearm. *Chimel v. California*, 295 U.S. 752, 763 (1969); *U.S. v. Robinson*, 414 U.S. 218, 235 (1973).

134. Kelly added that he fully supported O'Donnell's decision not to prosecute.

#### DEFENDANTS FIRED OFFICER LOWE

135. On March 16, 2026, Mayor Antoskiewicz, Officer Redrup, Officer Stolarski, and outside attorney Budzik called Officer Lowe in for a meeting. There, Antoskiewicz and Budzik informed Lowe that he was going to be fired and gave him a notice of disciplinary action.

136. Budzik had Stolarski read off the narrative from his investigative report. Budzik reaffirmed repeatedly that Officer Lowe supposedly violated department policies.

137. In the notice of disciplinary action, Antoskiewicz claimed Officer Lowe improperly released police records in violation of his oath of office, department rules, and the city's public-records policy.

138. Antoskiewicz laid out the City's version of events surrounding the improper-handling charge's deletion.

139. He claimed that, after the arrest, Prosecutor McDonnell reviewed the body-camera footage. Antoskiewicz claimed that prosecutor McDonnell did not pursue the improper-handling charges because "it was highly likely the City could not prove the charges," even though O'Callahan was visibly intoxicated, had a gun on him, and had a gun within reach of the driver's seat.

140. Again, the City admitted that McDonnell told Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler to remove the felony charges from the charges tab in the Sundance system and update the report. McDonnell claimed the charges were not viable because Officer Lowe (1) didn't report smelling alcohol, and (2) O'Callahan refused a breathalyzer test and to do roadside-sobriety tests, as is his constitutional right. McDonnell gave no other reasons for why the video footage of O'Callahan slurring his speech, admitting he drank some amount of alcohol, walking off-balance, and being unable to recognize someone right in front of his face would not be enough to convict. And, Det. Zahursky wrote in his BMV 2255 report that he smelled on O'Callahan the odor of an alcoholic beverage.

141. Even if this were true—and it wasn't and was indeed misleading—Officer Lowe's original report was a public record. Permanently altering it is not allowed under Ohio law. And,

as explained above, this violated North Royalton Police Department's own policies regarding records.

142. In the notice, Antoskiewicz also noted the media attention surrounding O'Callahan's case and the subsequent follow-up. Antoskiewicz wrote the following:

**On October 28 and 29, 2025, the City received multiple records requests from local media stations for the charges against Mr. O'Callahan. On WKYC (NBC), Channel 3 broadcast report on October 29, 2025, the formal complaint against Mr. O'Callahan was shown, unredacted, in full view on the screen. A person is shown holding a sheaf of papers and leafs through them on camera revealing Mr. O'Callahan's unredacted, personal identifier form, NRPD policy 322, a fax cover sheet from FOP Lodge Attorney Brian J. Smith, various emails and the unredacted formal complaint against Mr. O'Callahan. The originals of police documents are kept by the NRPD Records and would not be released to anyone, including the media. Such records in the media stories were unredacted and were not released by the NRPD Records Room after necessary and required redactions. Subsequently, proper records requests from the media were provided redacted copies of records.**

143. Antoskiwicz tried to connect the dots between Officer Lowe's whistleblower report and media outlets receiving documents showing Lt. Cutler and Chief Tarase's wrongdoing, even though the investigation yielded no evidence that Officer Lowe ever spoke to the media.

144. Indeed, in a letter accompanying the investigation report, Chief Tarase admitted that it's unclear how the documents reached the news media. There was no evidence that Officer Lowe gave any documents to the media.

145. Still, Defendants were punishing Officer Lowe for something he did not do.

146. The entire investigation was pretextual. Antoskiewicz claimed that Hofelich's report on Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler mentioned "that it appeared records may have been released in an improper manner." In fact, the report mentions no such thing.

147. In Antoskiewicz’s disciplinary notice, he concluded that Officer Lowe improperly released records when he sent them to his union representative, Smith, and even Antoskiewicz, the City’s safety service director and mayor, within Officer Lowe’s chain of command.

148. In a weak, pretextual excuse for firing Officer Lowe, Antoskiewicz wrote, “[y]ou are not being recommended for disciplinary action because you filed a complaint. The complaint you filed did, however, contain NRPD records which you obtained and disseminated improperly.”

149. Essentially, Antoskiewicz admitted he was firing Officer Lowe for the contents of his report—for sending proof of felony crimes to the person to whom, under Ohio law, he was supposed to blow the whistle.

150. Under R.C. 4113.52(A)(1)(f), if an employer fails to correct the action the whistleblower reported within 24 hours, “the person may file a written report that provides sufficient detail to identify and describe the violation with the prosecuting authority of the county or municipal corporation where the violation occurred.”

151. That day, Chief Tarase placed Officer Lowe on administrative leave.

152. The move was shocking, especially considering that Tarase previously failed to discipline a female records clerk—one that he is reportedly “obsessed with”<sup>5</sup>—for releasing confidential, unredacted records. The previous year, a records clerk failed to redact a domestic violence witness’s address, and officers had to patrol the victim’s street once an hour to ensure her safety. Chief Tarase and Mayor Antoskiewicz failed to discipline her.

153. On March 26, 2026, at the police station, Chief Tarase held a meeting for North Royalton officers. Complete with PowerPoint, Tarase gave an entire presentation on why he was in the right when he tampered with Officer Lowe's report. He painted Officer Lowe out to be an incompetent officer who performed a poor stop.

154. He made the presentation to a different group of officers on April 9, 2026.

155. Antoskiewicz ultimately followed through on his threats and terminated Officer Lowe on April 14, 2026.

156. Officer Lowe has since struggled to find a new job in law enforcement. Every time he applies for a job, he must disclose that he was fired from North Royalton Police Department.

157. Ever obsessed with media coverage of the cover-up, on April 15, 2026, police officials put out a public press release about firing officer Lowe and demoting Sgt. Rybicki for helping him, thus seeking to destroy his reputation.

158. Since felony-charge cover-up received publicity, many North Royalton citizens have raised their concerns through letters, calls, and at city-council meetings about the police department's misplaced priorities and potential corruption, and the chief and mayor's misconduct.

**CLAIM 1**  
**FIRST AMENDMENT RETALIATION UNDER 42 U.S.C. § 1983**  
**(AGAINST DEFENDANTS TARASE, AND ANTOSKIEWICZ)**

159. Plaintiff incorporates all previous allegations.

160. Officer Lowe was a public employee, who Defendants believe engaged in protected activity by speaking out about a matter of public concern—the attempted cover-up of a fellow police officer's felony criminal activity. It has been clearly established law for decades that

public employees have the right to communicate about matters of public concern and that public officials may not retaliate against people, including public employees, for protected speech. All public officials have been charged with knowing that public employees may not be disciplined for engaging in protected speech on matters of public concern. Despite department policies regarding confidentiality, this prohibition specifically includes public officials' inability to lawfully discipline or target employees who speak out, as such department policies cannot supersede employees' constitutional rights.

161. A person does not actually have to engage in protected activity to be protected from retaliation. Defendants' mistaken belief that an individual exercised his First Amendment rights brings that individual within the constitutional protection. *Hijfernan v. City of Paterson*, 578 U.S. 266, 266–67 (2016).

162. Officer Lowe's ordinary official duties did not involve communicating with the media. Had he shared information with the media about the cover-up and O'Callahan's arrest, it would have been in his capacity as a private citizen and not as part of his ordinary job responsibilities. *Buddenberg v. Weisdack*, 939 F.3d 732, 740 (6th Cir. 2019).

163. The publicized information about which Defendants were angry—documents showing that Lt. Cutler and Chief Tarase tampered with Officer Lowe's report to delete the felony charge against O'Callahan—was on a matter of public concern and was of legitimate news interest in the community. Since felony-charge cover-up received publicity, many North Royalton citizens have raised their concerns through letters, calls, and at city-council meetings about the police department's misplaced priorities and potential corruption, and the chief and mayor's misconduct.

164. Defendants engaged in at least the following acts of retaliation that would chill a person of ordinary firmness, including, but not limited to, the following:

- a. Subjecting Officer Lowe to an investigation into whether he had shared information and public records with the media;
- b. Placing him on administrative leave;
- c. Going on a coordinated public smear campaign to tarnish his reputation as a police officer; and
- d. Ultimately firing him.

165. The adverse actions described above were sufficient to deter a person of ordinary firmness from continuing to engage in the alleged protected conduct.

166. Defendants retaliated against Officer Lowe for—in their best belief and despite an investigation to the contrary—causing negative publicity by sharing information with the media and others, thus exposing Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler’s attempt to protect a fellow officer by deleting a felony charge from a public record. Their belief that Officer Lowe was responsible for this information being shared with the press was a substantial or motivating factor in their decision to begin the “investigation” and to eventually fire him.

167. The retaliation was explicitly linked to Defendants’ belief that Officer Lowe released public records to the public. That was the stated scope of the investigation that ultimately led to Officer Lowe’s firing. And, in the notice of discipline, Mayor Antoskiewicz linked the discipline to the public release of the documents.

168. Defendants also violated Officer Lowe’s rights when they retaliated against him for reporting Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler’s conduct to the Cuyahoga County prosecutor’s office, BCI, and the FBI.

169. Officer Lowe engaged in protected activity when he reported the attempted cover-up of a fellow police officer's felony criminal activity. It is clearly established law that public employees have the right to communicate about matters of public concern and that public officials may not retaliate against them for that protected speech.

170. Officer Lowe's ordinary duties did not involve communicating with the county prosecutor's office, BCI, or the FBI. His speech on Tarase and Cutler's misconduct constituted speech as a private citizen. *Buddenberg v. Weisdack*, 939 F.3d 732, 740 (6th Cir. 2019).

171. Defendants retaliated against Officer Lowe for seeking prosecution for Cutler and Tarase's criminal acts. Their knowledge of these reports was a substantial or motivating factor in their decision to begin the "investigation" and to eventually fire him.

172. As a direct and proximate result of Defendants' retaliation, Officer Lowe has suffered and will continue to suffer economic and non-economic damages for which Defendants are liable, including, but not limited to, pain and suffering, emotional distress, inconvenience, the loss of salary, wages, and benefits, and other terms, privileges, and conditions of employment.

173. Defendants' acts were wanton, willful, egregious, malicious, and are worthy of substantial action to punish and deter them and others from engaging in this type of unlawful conduct.

CLAIM 2  
*MONELL* LIABILITY UNDER 42 U.S.C. § 1983  
(AGAINST DEFENDANT CITY OF NORTH ROYALTON)

174. Plaintiff incorporates all previous allegations.

175. Defendants Antoskiewicz and Tarase—as the mayor/safety-service director and police chief—are sufficiently empowered public officials that their acts constitute official policies

and practices of the City of North Royalton. They are final decisionmakers with respect to discipline and employment status.

176. Based on a mistaken belief that Officer Lowe engaged in protected speech, the individual Defendants instituted a campaign of retaliation that ended in Officer Lowe's firing from the police department.

177. This retaliation was the official policy of the city of North Royalton.

178. Defendant City has failed to provide the relevant personnel with training on the First Amendment and its protections—including the prohibition on retaliating against public employees for protected speech.

179. Defendant City failed to do this despite its primary outside counsel, James Budzik, himself having been a defendant in a First Amendment–retaliation case. *See Buddenberg v. Weisdack*, 939 F.3d 732, 741–42 (6th Cir. 2019).

180. As a direct and proximate result of Defendants' retaliation, Officer Lowe has suffered and will continue to suffer economic and non-economic damages for which Defendants are liable, including, but not limited to, pain and suffering, emotional distress, inconvenience, the loss of salary, wages, and benefits, and other terms, privileges, and conditions of employment.

**CLAIM 3**  
**FIRST AMENDMENT RETALIATION UNDER 42 U.S.C. § 1983**  
**(AGAINST DEFENDANTS TARASE AND ANTOSKIEWICZ)**

181. Plaintiff incorporates all previous allegations.

182. Officer Lowe engaged in protected activity when he included his union representative, Brian Smith, on his whistleblower report to mayor Antoskiewicz.

183. It has been clearly established law for decades that public employees have a right to communicate about matters of public concern and that public officials may not retaliate

against people, including public employees, for protected speech. Speaking out about potential corruption is speaking on a matter of public concern.

184. In the Sixth Circuit, it is clearly established law that “speech in connection with union activities is speech ‘as a citizen’ for the purposes of the First Amendment.” *Boulton v. Swanson*, 795 F.3d 526, 534 (6th Cir. 2015).

185. Defendants engaged in the following acts of retaliation that would chill a person of ordinary firmness, including, but not limited to, the following:

- a. Subjecting Officer Lowe to an investigation into whether he had shared information and public records with the media;
- b. Placing him on administrative leave;
- c. Going on a coordinated smear campaign to tarnish his reputation as a police officer; and
- d. Ultimately firing him.

186. The adverse actions described above were sufficient to deter a person of ordinary firmness from continuing to engage in the alleged protected conduct.

187. Defendants retaliated against Officer Lowe for sharing with his union representative, Smith, documents showing Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler’s attempt to protect a fellow officer by deleting from a public record a felony charge. This was a substantial or motivating factor in their decision to fire Officer Lowe.

188. The retaliation was explicitly linked to Officer Lowe’s act of including Smith on his whistleblower report. Mayor Antoskiewicz said as much in his disciplinary report.

189. As a direct and proximate result of Defendants’ retaliation, Officer Lowe has suffered and will continue to suffer economic and non-economic damages for which Defendants

are liable, including, but not limited to, pain and suffering, emotional distress, inconvenience, the loss of salary, wages, and benefits, and other terms, privileges, and conditions of employment.

190. Defendants' acts were wanton, willful, egregious, malicious, and are worthy of substantial action to punish and deter them and others from engaging in this type of unlawful conduct.

**CLAIMS 4(A THROUGH F)  
CIVIL LIABILITY FOR CRIMINAL ACTS UNDER R.C. 2307.60(A)(1) AND COMPLICITY AND  
AIDING AND ABETTING UNDER R.C. 2923.03  
(AGAINST DEFENDANTS TARASE AND ANTOSKIEWICZ.)**

**(A) R.C. 2921.45 (INTERFERENCE WITH CIVIL AND STATUTORY RIGHTS)**

**(B) R.C. 2921.04(A) (INTIMIDATION OF ATTORNEY, VICTIM, OR WITNESS TO A  
CRIMINAL ACT)**

**(C) R.C. 2921.05 (RETALIATING AGAINST A WITNESS)**

**(D) R.C. 2921.03(A) AND (C) (INTIMIDATION)**

**(E) R.C. 2913.42(A)(1) (TAMPERING WITH RECORDS)**

**(F) R.C. 2921.13(A)(2) AND (3) (FALSIFICATION)**

191. Plaintiff incorporates all previous allegations.

192. R.C. 2307.60 provides: "Anyone injured in person or property by a criminal act has, and may recover full damages in, a civil action. R.C. 2307.60(A)(1). Section 2307.60 "independently authorize[s] a civil action for damages caused by criminal acts." *Jacobson v. Kiforey*, 149 Ohio St. 3d 398, 399 (2016). And no proof of an underlying criminal conviction is required when bringing a civil action under § 2307.60. *Buddenberg v. Weisdack*, 161 Ohio St. 3d 160, 2020-Ohio-3832, 161 N.E.3d 603, ¶ 11.

193. For the Court's convenience, criminal acts Defendants committed or were complicit in are consolidated under this single claim, although any single one of them would establish separate civil liability under § 2307.60.

194. Under R.C. 2921.45 (**Interfering with civil rights**), “[n]o public servant, under color of the public servant's office, employment, or authority, shall knowingly deprive, or conspire or attempt to deprive any person of a constitutional or statutory right.”

195. Defendants, along with James Budzik and Prosecutor McDonnell, deprived Officer Lowe of his civil rights and conspired to do so when they fired him in retaliation for speaking to his union representative. Alternatively, Defendants deprived Officer Lowe of his rights when they fired him in retaliation for his perceived speech—their mistaken assumption that he spoke with the media and gave them documents showing Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler's misconduct—or his speech to the Cuyahoga County prosecutor, BCI, or the FBI.

196. Under R.C. § 2921.04(A) (**intimidation of attorney, victim or witness**), “no person shall knowingly attempt to intimidate a witness to a criminal or delinquent act by reason of the person being a witness to that act.”

197. Defendants knowingly attempted to intimidate Officer Lowe, who witnessed Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler's corrupt and criminal actions, by launching an investigation into him and ultimately firing him. Defendants continue this campaign of intimidation by continuing to smear Officer Lowe's name and reputation, which will affect his ability to find another job in law enforcement.

198. Under R.C. § 2921.05(A) (**retaliation**), “[n]o person, purposely and by force or by unlawful threat of harm to any person or property, shall retaliate against a ... witness who was involved in a civil or criminal action or proceeding because the ... witness discharged the duties

of the ... witness.”

199. Defendants purposely retaliated against Officer Lowe when they threatened to fire him—and ultimately did—taking away his salary and benefits because he was a witness to their criminal activity.

200. Under R.C. § 2913.42(A)(1) (**tampering with records**), “[n]o person, knowing the person has no privilege to do so, and with purpose to defraud or knowing that the person is facilitating a fraud, shall do any of the following: (1) Falsify, destroy, remove, conceal, alter, deface, or mutilate any writing, computer software, data, or record.”

201. Defendants, with purpose to defraud or knowing that they were facilitating a fraud, falsified writings, data, and records, knowing them to have been tampered with, by creating false documentation that Officer Lowe had somehow done something wrong by blowing the whistle on Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler for tampering with public records.

202. These falsified writings and records include, but are not limited to, Hofelich’s report discrediting Officer Lowe’s reports and the city’s documentation stemming from the investigation into Officer Lowe claiming that Officer Lowe incorrectly released police documents.

203. Under R.C. § 2921.13(A)(2), (3) (**falsification**), “[n]o person shall knowingly make a false statement, or knowingly swear or affirm the truth of a false statement previously made, when any of the following applies: ... (2) The statement is made with purpose to incriminate another; (3) The statement is made with purpose to mislead a public official in performing the public official’s official function.”

204. Defendants engaged and are continuing to engage in falsification by creating and causing to be made false oral and written statements that Officer Lowe had improperly revealed

confidential police records and that, in doing so, he violated the department's policies and procedures. They made and are making these statements with the purpose to incriminate Officer Lowe and with the purpose to mislead public officials in performing their official functions.

205. These false, gaslighting statements include, but are not limited to, Hofelich's report discrediting Officer Lowe's reports and the city's documentation stemming from the investigation into Officer Lowe claiming that Officer Lowe incorrectly released police documents.

206. R.C. 2923.03 criminalizes various forms of complicity, including conspiring with another to commit an offense, aiding and abetting another, and causing an otherwise innocent person to commit an offense.

207. Defendants were complicit with one another, as well as outside attorney Budzik, prosecutor McDonnell, and Lt. Cutler, in plotting and performing these actions.

208. As a direct and proximate result of Defendants' actions, Officer Lowe has suffered and will continue to suffer economic and non-economic damages for which the named Defendants are liable, including, but not limited to, pain and suffering; the loss of salary, wages, and benefits; and other terms, privileges, and conditions of employment.

#### **PRAYER FOR RELIEF**

For the above reasons, Plaintiff respectfully requests the following relief from the Court:

- A. Declare that Defendants' acts and conduct constitute violations of state law;
- B. Enter judgment in Mr. Lowe's favor on all claims for relief;
- C. Award Mr. Lowe full compensatory damages, both economic and non-economic, and including, but not limited to, damages for back pay, front pay, pain and

suffering, mental anguish, emotional distress, humiliation, reputational harm, and inconvenience that he has suffered and is reasonably certain to suffer in the future;

- D. Award Mr. Lowe punitive damages as appropriate for all intentional and malicious violations of state-law rights;
- E. Award Mr. Lowe liquidated damages as appropriate under Ohio law;
- F. Award Mr. Lowe pre-judgment and post-judgment interest at the highest lawful rate;
- G. Award Mr. Lowe his reasonable attorney fees and all other costs of this suit (including expert fees);
- H. Award all other relief in law or equity to which Mr. Lowe is entitled and that the Court deems equitable, just, or proper.

#### JURY DEMAND

Plaintiff Spencer Lowe demands a trial by jury on all issues within this complaint.

I represent Fraternal Order of Police Lodge 15 and Patrolman Spencer Lowe. Enclosed please find Patrolman Lowe's written notice under R.C. 4113.52(A)(1)(f), along with supporting documentation.

By way of background, North Royalton Patrolman Lowe conducted a traffic stop on Orange Village Deputy Chief Patrick O'Callahan on October 11, 2025. The Deputy Chief was found to be impaired and in possession of multiple firearms. Patrolman Lowe placed him under arrest, proceeded with an OVI charge, a traffic citation, and prepared a felony charge under R.C. 2923.16 for Improper Handling of a Firearm. Patrolman Lowe then completed his narrative report, which was approved by his sergeant and included the felony charge. While awaiting further proceedings on the felony charge, he was informed that the city's prosecutor directed him to "hold off." It was later discovered that his report and narrative had been altered without his knowledge or consent, with material information deleted. The city's RMS software confirms that records indicate North Royalton Chief Tarase and Lt. Cutler accessed Patrolman Lowe's report and changes were made, or they acted as conspirators in the alteration. Screenshots are available that verify Tarase and Cutler's access to the report. It has also been confirmed that the felony charge was never pursued against Deputy Chief O'Callahan.

While Patrolman Lowe is not in possession of a hard copy of the original report, there are individuals within the department, including his approving sergeant, who can confirm the alteration. You will also find attached supporting documentation. In addition, the RMS auditing software will confirm the access history and deletions. Patrolman Lowe does not have access to those auditing tools, but his union and counsel are in possession of screenshots corroborating the access by Tarase and Cutler. Your office can also obtain complete audit records through a preservation and production order.





---

On Saturday, October 11, 2025, at approximately 2350 hrs. I (Ptl. Lowe 5434) was on routine patrol in a marked police cruiser in the area of Royalton Rd and Bennett Rd w/b.

While I was stopped at the intersection, I observed a black sedan traveling s/b on Bennett Rd make a sweeping wide right turn traveling into the left turn lane for Royalton Rd e/b traffic. The vehicle continued to travel w/b on Royalton Rd. While the sedan was passing Advanced Auto located at 7449 Royalton Rd., I observed it veer left out of its lane of travel into the center turn lane. I continued to follow the black sedan where I reached speeds in excess of 60 mph in an attempt to catch up to the vehicle, but maintained a steady distance between my cruiser and the black sedan. While in the area of 8001 Royalton Rd., I observed the vehicle travel left of center occupying half of the opposite lane of travel. I activated my overhead emergency lights to initiate a traffic stop while the sedan entered the right turn lane for Dover Farms Dr. from Royalton Rd. The vehicle stopped shortly thereafter.

I exited my patrol vehicle and approached the black sedan on the drivers. It was bearing Ohio Registration [REDACTED]. While there, I observed a white male operator later identified as Patrick Jeremiah O'Callahan operating the vehicle. Patrick immediately handed me his drivers license. I asked Patrick if he knew the reason for the stop and he stated, "was I speeding?" I informed him of the numerous moving violations that I observed. I asked Patrick where he was coming from and he stated, "I'm just coming home." I asked Patrick again where he was coming from. Patrick again stated "I'm coming home." I informed Patrick that I was aware of where he was headed, and again asked where he was coming from.

I asked Patrick where the Village of Orange was located. While he attempted to inform me that it was located in Cuyahoga County, he was having great difficulty saying "Cuyahoga," slurring his speech. While speaking with Patrick, I observed him to have red, bloodshot, watery eyes. I asked Patrick how much he had to drink tonight. Patrick stated "not much," while slurring his speech. I asked Patrick, what is not much and he stated "uh, not much." I returned to my patrol car asking for OIC Ptl. Bunge (5438) to assist. Ptl. Bunge and Ptl. Zahursky (5450) arrived shortly thereafter.

I approached Patrick's vehicle again asking him to exit the vehicle. Patrick responded to my request by saying "um, I live right here." I advised Patrick that I was more than aware of where he resided as he had informed me numerous times. I asked Patrick if he had a firearm on him and he stated yes. Patrick began to reach for the firearm, attempting to put his hand in his front right shorts pocket. I advised Patrick not to touch the firearm and to exit the vehicle again. Patrick responded asking "are you serious?" I assured Patrick that I was serious and to exit the vehicle.

While Patrick was exiting the vehicle, it appeared that he was steadying his balance by holding onto the door and door frame of the car. After Patrick exited the car, I checked Patrick for the firearm and I located it in his front right pocket. The firearm was a Taurus TCP 380 bearing serial number [REDACTED]. When I located the firearm, Patrick began stating "I know Zahursky." The handgun was found to be loaded with a six round magazine and a round in the chamber. I made the firearm safe and placed it on the hood of my patrol car.

I asked Patrick to walk to the rear of his vehicle. While doing so, Patrick stated "I'm not doing anything, I live right here so that's fine." During our conversation, Patrick continued to inform me where he resided. I asked Patrick if he would perform any field sobriety tests (SFST's) and he

stated no. I informed Patrick that if he did not perform any SFST's, that I would have to make a decision based of the aforementioned observations. Patrick asked me what my observations where while slurring his speech. I informed Patrick again of the moving violations and signs of impairment. Patrick refused any SFST's and also refused to provide a breath sample.

At that time, I walked back to my patrol car and advised dispatch of the serial number on the Taurus handgun. Dispatch advised that it was coming back NIF (nothing in file) through LEADS. While I was speaking with dispatch, Ptl. Bunge was conversing with Patrick. Ptl. Bunge asked Patrick "how well do you know Steve (Ptl. Zahursky)?" Patrick responded "Steve, I know Steve very well," with slurred speech. Ptl. Bunge asked Patrick if he knew if Steve was working tonight. Patrick responded by stating that Steve was not working, that he is in the bureau. During this conversation, Ptl. Zahursky (Steve) was standing directly in front of Patrick but he could not identify him. Patrick proceeded to ask Ptl. Bunge if he could go home.

I returned and spoke with Patrick. I attempted one last time asking Patrick if he would perform any of the SFST's and he refused again. Patrick also refused to provide a breath sample again. I asked Patrick to turn around so that I could place him in handcuffs. While doing so, he lost his balance and stumbled while placing his hands behind his back. At that time, Patrick was placed in handcuffs in accordance to NRPD policy for OVI. Ptl. Zahursky conducted a search incident to arrest of Patrick. Patrick was placed in the back of Ptl. Zahursky's patrol car and transported to the NRPD jail.

Ptl. Bunge and I returned to Patrick's vehicle and we conducted a probable cause search of the vehicle. While doing so, I located a Smith and Wesson 9 Shield Plus loaded in the center console . The serial number on the firearm ( [REDACTED] ) was ran through LEADS by dispatch coming back NIF. The firearm was later found to contain 13 rounds in the magazine with one round in the chamber, totaling 14 rounds.

Ptl. Bunge and I continued our probable cause search of the vehicle and located what appeared to be a duty belt under a uniform shirt in the back seat. I removed the uniform shirt to find a pistol in it's holster. The pistol was a Glock 17 9mm handgun with serial number [REDACTED] It was also ran through LEADS by dispatch coming back NIF. The pistol was later found to contain 17 rounds in the magazine with one round in the chamber, totaling 18 rounds. Patrick's vehicle was parked in front of the club house with his police issued gear in the trunk and the vehicle secured.

The firearms were confiscated as evidence, later photographed and entered into evidence. At the NRPD jail, I read the BMV 2255 to Patrick and advised him of the associated consequences. The NRPD CO asked if Patrick would provide a breath sample and he refused. Patrick was charged with OVI 4511.19 (A)(1)(a), Speed 4511.21, and Left of Center 4511.25, NR20251071. The duty judge was contacted at 0730 hrs on 10/12/2025. They provided a bond of \$5,000/10% and a court date of Tuesday, October 14, 2025 at 1030 hrs. in court room one at Parma Municipal Court. Body and dash camera footage is available for this incident. This report is complete.

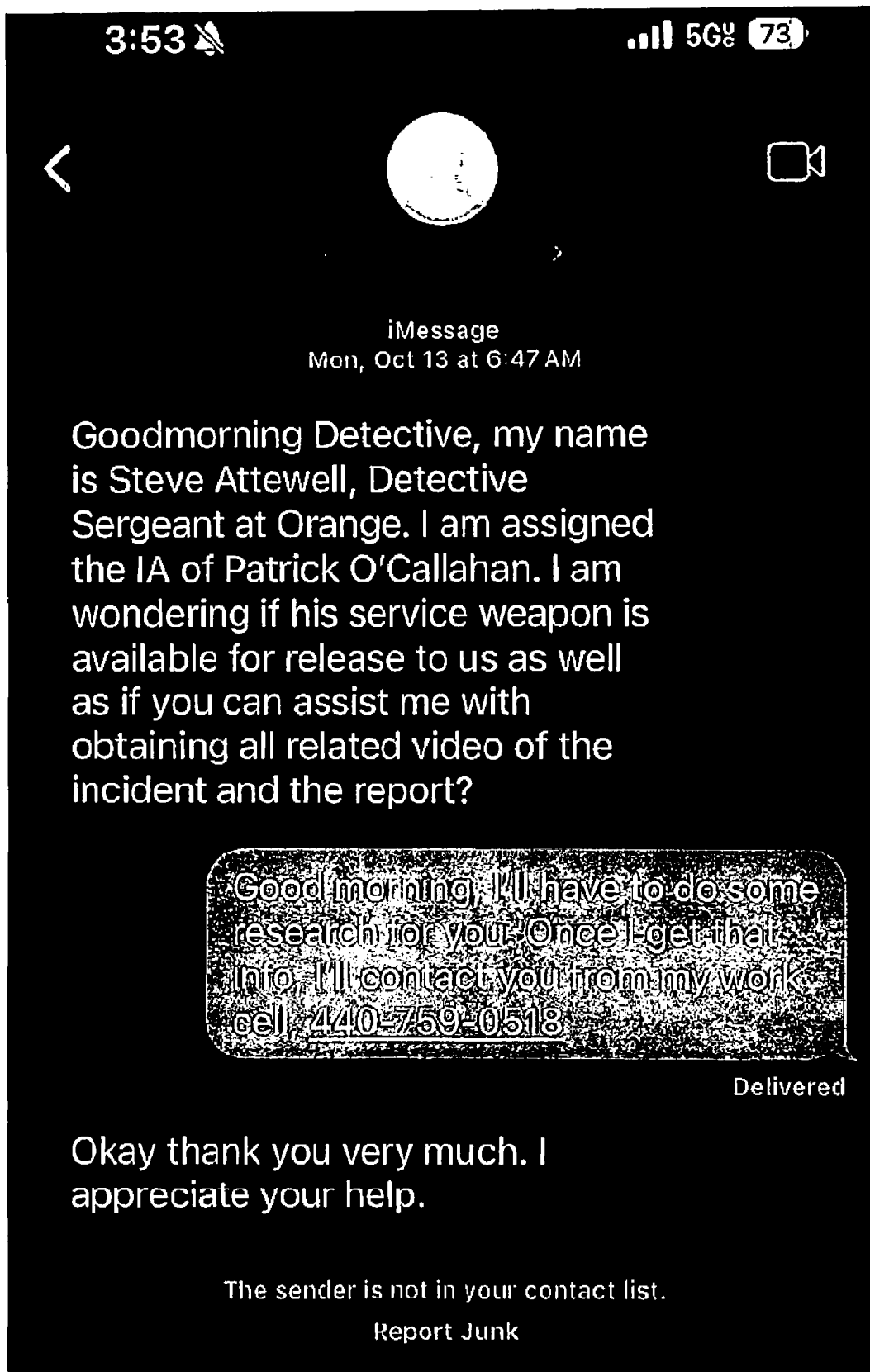

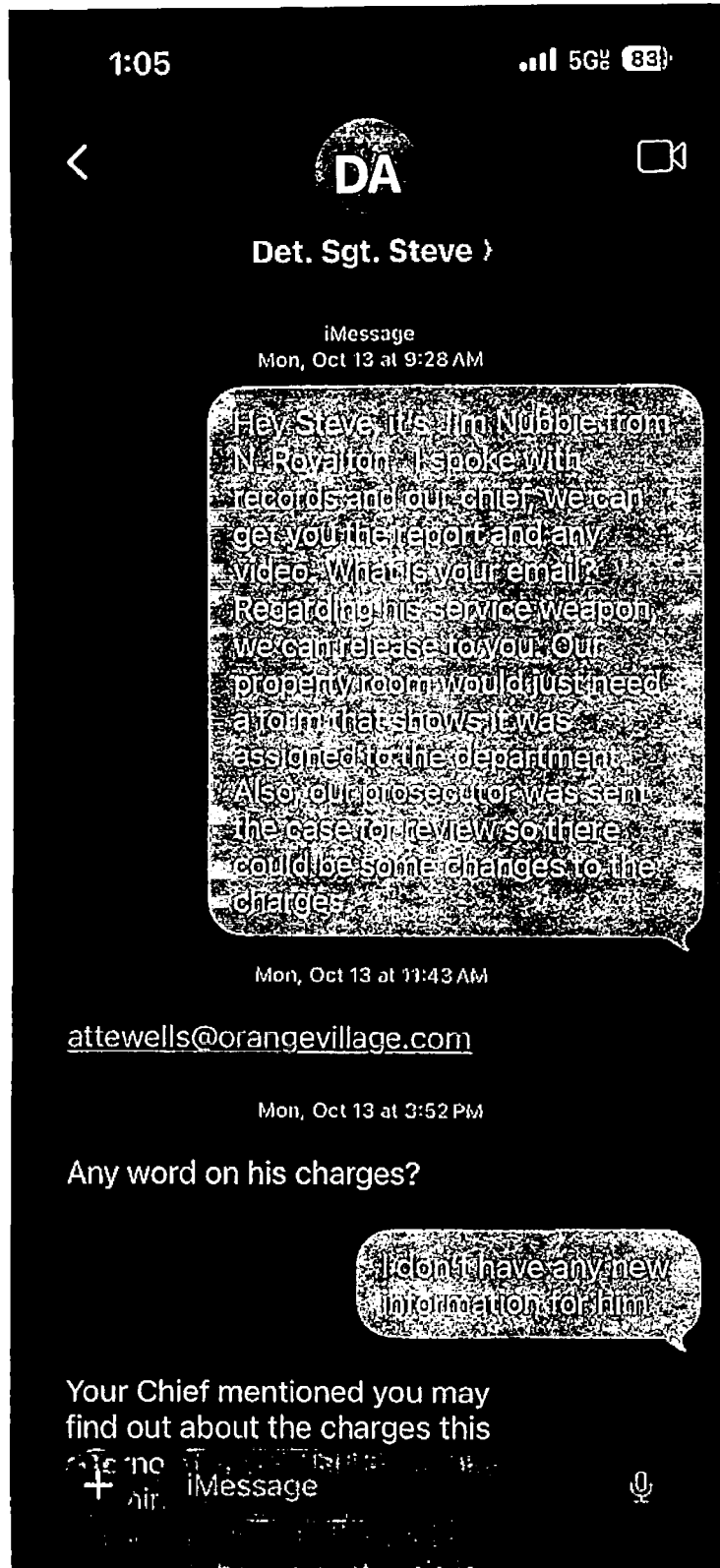
